How To Get To And From The Ship



By Air:

The nearest airport to Kitimat is in Terrace, BC, about a 45-minute cab ride from the MK Bay Marina. This airport is the Northwest Regional Airport. The following airlines fly daily from Vancouver to Terrace:

Taxi to the Ship

Prior to leaving for your trip you will need to call to reserve a taxi to take you from the airport to the ship at MK Bay Marina.

Things to Do in Kitimat on the Day Your Trip Starts, Before You Board



If your flight arrives earlier than 1.5 hours before the trip start on the day of the trip start, you may have a couple of hours available before the boarding time.

The Kitimat area is comprised of **two communities**: Kitimat (originally a mill town) and Kitamaat Village, the village of the Haisla people. They are separated from each other by a road that goes around the head of an inlet, which is about a 15-minute drive. See map to left.

As with many coastal communities, public transportation options are extremely limited or nonexistent so you need to plan to get around with a vehicle such as a taxi.

One option for this time is to plan to visit the gallery of master Haisla carver Sammy Robinson, and have lunch before or afterward. Sammy does not have set hours and says "just drop by". If you wish to contact him, the info is:

Sammy Robinson Gallery, tel 250-632-9790, address 416 Hasila Ave in Kitamaat Village (near MK Bay Marina -- not to be confused with Haisla Blvd in Kitimat).

You need to make arrangements with the taxi company to do this.

There are limited places for lunch. If you go into the town of Kitimat first, there are a few places there. If you visit Sammy's gallery first, then, at the time of this writing, MK Bay Marina has sandwiches available in the shop above the docks. Contact them to confirm.

If you would like assistance making your travel arrangements, we are happy to refer you to a travel agent who has worked with Maple Leaf guests before.

We highly recommend trip cancellation insurance that protects you in case certain kinds of emergencies prevent you from making your trip. Ask your travel agent for information. It may be purchased at the time your payment becomes non-refundable.

Due to the remoteness of the areas we travel in we highly
recommend travel/medical insurance that covers possible
emergency medical evacuation. Check your existing coverage
to see if it's included.
