About Time Zones

We begin and end our journey in Alaska Daylight Time (UTC-9h). When you cross the border from BC or Washington State to Alaska, you will gain one hour. Your flight times will be in the local times. This is an interesting fact that shouldn't affect any flight bookings.

Travel Agent and Medical/Trip Insurance

If you would like assistance making your travel arrangements, we are happy to refer you to a travel agent who has worked with Maple Leaf guests before.

We highly recommend trip cancellation insurance that protects you in case certain kinds of emergencies prevent you from making your trip. Ask your travel agent for information. It may be purchased at the time your payment becomes nonrefundable.

Due to the remoteness of the areas we travel in we <u>highly</u> recommend travel/medical insurance that covers possible emergency medical evacuation. Check your existing coverage to see if it's included.

All guests, regardless of nationality must have their passport with them, and any other required documentation. Passport must be valid for at least 6 months past trip finish date. Be sure, too, that you have supplied us your passport information, on your questionnaire. We must to provide this to federal agencies. People who are not Canadian or American must be sure to fill out the ESTA (Electronic System of Travel Authorization) and, if your trip includes Canada, the new Canadian eTA (Electronic Travel Authorization). You are responsible for completing all the required steps needed to travel within the USA, and Canada if applicable. Thank you.


If for any reason you are delayed on the day that you are to meet the ship, please call us so that we can try to assist you in getting to the ship on time. Call us at:
